Elective units:

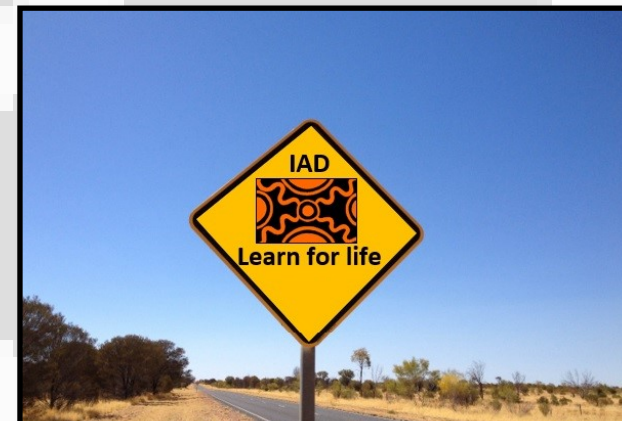
FSKLRG02 Identify strategies to respond to basic workplace problems
