If you think your previous study and/or experiences may be relevant to the unit (s) in which you are enrolling discuss this when you enrol.

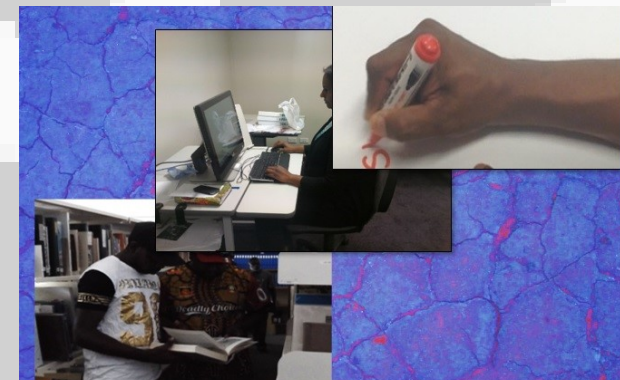

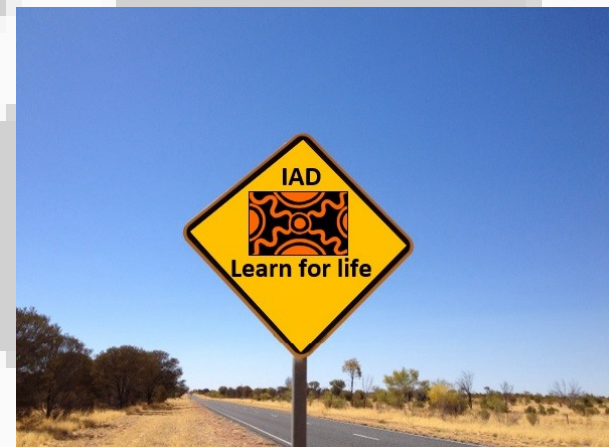
